Village of Western Springs Community Garden Program 2026 Membership Pass Application, Rules, and Release Forms

Each membership to the Fair Elms Community Garden (“FECG”) is issued per annual season and is good only for the season in which it is issued. **The number of Yearly Membership Passes issued each calendar year will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis.** All Members must be at least eighteen (18) years of age, be a Village resident, or be a local business owner. A Village-based community group can apply for and hold a Yearly Membership Pass as well.

Members may visit the FECG site from dawn to dusk during the growing season (April 1st to November 15th).

A Yearly Membership Pass consists of the opportunity to use a planter box, or a portion thereof, for planting vegetables and other food items by a Member. If necessary FECG shall determine the planter box size, or the portion of a planter box, which will be provided to each selected Member each year and may adjust such planter box size as needed to allow maximum participation and usage of the site. Available plot sizes and their yearly fee are as follows:

Approximate Sizes	
4'x3'	\$5
4'x4'	\$7
4'x4'x3'(tall)	\$7
7'x3.5'	\$10
4'x8'	\$13
10'x10'	\$40

Planter box assignments are initially limited to no more than one (1) planter box per household, group, or organization. If more than one is requested during the initial application period it will be allocated after March 31 on a first come first served basis if the requested plots are available.

Acceptance of applications shall be governed, in the FECG's sole discretion, by an open application period with advanced public notice on the Village's website of an application submittal deadline with either (1) a “first to submit, first to be selected” acceptance process or (2) a lottery selection system. However, priority will first be given to Village of Western Springs Residents, then Village of Western Springs Resident Community Groups, then owners of land within the Village, and then to members of the Village of Western Springs Business Community (“Priority Rule”).

A. For the 2026 Season the open application period will be January 31st through March 31st.

Applications shall be submitted to The Fair Elms Community Garden via mail to 5405 Fair Elms Avenue, Western Springs, IL 60558 (labeled ("Attn: Fair Elms Community Garden"). Acceptance into the Program for Season 2026 and subsequent seasons shall be governed, in FECG and the Village's sole discretion, by (1) a "first to submit, first to be selected" acceptance process or (2) a lottery selection system, which will be noted in the public notice for the Community Garden Program on the Village's website.

- B. For applications that are submitted on the same date and at the same time, ties shall be resolved by the organizers of the Community Garden by a coin toss if a resolution cannot be otherwise found.

Village of Western Springs Community Garden Program 2026 Rules and Conditions for Membership

- 1. YOU DO NOT OWN YOUR PLANTER BOX.** You are being given an opportunity to garden a small planter box owned by the Village of Western Springs ("Village"). Use of your planter box is a privilege, not a right. If you do not have time to tend to your planter box in an acceptable manner, please do not request a planter box.
- 2. STAY OUT OF OTHER PLANTER BOXES (AND KEEP YOUR CHILDREN OUT OF OTHER PLANTER BOXES) UNLESS SPECIFICALLY INVITED.** Your gardening activity and plant growth must be restricted to your planter box. You may assist another Member in tending to his/her planter box if invited to do so.
- 3. DO NOT TAKE OR PICK ANYTHING FROM ANOTHER PLANTER BOX.** You may not remove ANYTHING from another Member's planter box without his/her permission. Theft will not be tolerated and will result in a permanent revocation of Membership privileges.
- 4. NO TREES, SHRUBS, PERENNIALS, OR MINT ALLOWED.** Plantings in the Community Garden shall be limited to vegetables, other food items, and ornamental (flower) planting only. Nothing may be planted that will grow taller than a cornstalk.
- 5. STANDING TOWERS AND WALLS ARE NOT ALLOWED.** Structures, walls, or any assemblage of materials that intrude on another person's planter box is not permitted. Nothing in the planter box may be grown that is higher than a typical cornstalk. Planter boxes can have vertical trellis-like, open, airy structures, as well as poles and stakes for supporting climbing vegetables, vines or flowers, but said structures cannot exceed seventy-two (72) inches in height from ground level. Installation of open top wire mesh fencing is permitted for the purpose of protecting the vegetation from animals. Bird netting is not permitted. **DO NOT ERECT ANYTHING THAT WILL INTERFERE WITH ACCESS TO OR CREATE SHADE ON NEARBY OR ADJACENT PLANTER BOXES.** **YOU MUST MAINTAIN YOUR PLANTER BOX IN AN ACCEPTABLE MANNER.** There is no

such thing as inactive gardening. You are expected to actively garden your planter box (digging, sowing, planting, weeding, pruning, watering, harvesting, etc.) at least one hour per week during the growing season.

6. **ABANDONED OR INACTIVE PLANTER BOXES WILL BE CLEARED AND FORFEITED.** A warning letter will be mailed to any Member whose planter box looks untended or is abandoned. Weeds gone to seed are one example of abandonment. In cases of abandonment or failure to maintain, the FECG will mail to the Member a written notice to remedy the situation in ten (10) days. If, after ten (10) days, the situation has not been corrected, the planter box will be considered abandoned, and will be cleared or roto-tilled and may be assigned to another Member. No reimbursement for expenses incurred on abandoned planter boxes will be provided. No replanting will be allowed for the current season as well even if another member isn't assigned the box.
7. **NO CHEMICAL PESTICIDES ALLOWED.** All gardening activities must be completely, 100% organic. No synthetic/chemical herbicides, pesticides, fungicides or synthetic fertilizers are permitted on the site, including treated wood products used as edges/borders, unless prior approval is obtained from the Village.
8. **NO FERTILIZER ALLOWED.** The use of non-composted manure, non-vegetable matter (such as meat, fish or dairy), kitty litter, domestic pet waste, newspapers, grease or other non-organic matter is strictly prohibited.
9. **NO PETS ARE ALLOWED IN THE GARDEN AT ANY TIME.**
10. **YOU MUST WEAR APPROPRIATE SAFETY ATTIRE WHILE GARDENING.** Shirts and closed-toe, low-heeled, rubber sole shoes are required to be worn at all times while gardening.
11. **THERE WILL BE NO SUPERVISION OF THE FAIR ELMS COMMUNITY GARDEN SITE BY THE VILLAGE OR ANY OF ITS EMPLOYEES.**
12. **CLOSELY SUPERVISE YOUR CHILDREN.** Children under the age of 12 years of age should be closely monitored so that they do not wander or enter another gardener's planter box area. Running is not allowed in the garden area.
13. **EACH MEMBER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR WEEDING HIS/HER PLANTER BOX AND THE PATHS AROUND IT.** Planter box borders should be kept to the standard size so as not to encroach on pathways or other planter boxes. Pathways between planter boxes should be clear. Personal gardening tools/equipment shall not be stored at the Community Garden site. Vegetation from planter boxes should not hang into pathways. Vegetation outside of the boxes will be trimmed so the village lawn service can mow the site.
14. **DISPOSE OF YOUR WASTE MATERIALS EACH TIME YOU LEAVE THE GARDEN.** A trash receptacle on the site will be provided for the purposes of disposing of non-plant waste, such as paper, plastic, wire, rope, etc. *Plant waste should be disposed of in the following manner: Shake dirt off*

the roots and retain soil at the garden site. Dispose of plant waste in the compost pile located on the site.

- 15. DISEASED OR PEST-INFESTED PLANTS SHOULD BE REMOVED.** Ongoing control of pest grasses and weeds is required at all times.
- 16. THE VILLAGE IS NOT ABLE TO COMMIT TO PROVIDING A CONSTANT WATER SOURCE AT THE GARDENING SITE.** The Members shall be responsible for watering their plants.
- 17. HARVEST ALL RIPE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES ON A DAILY BASIS.**
- 18. PLANTER BOXES MUST BE CLEARED OF ALL PLANTS NO LATER THAN THE 15th OF NOVEMBER.**
After November 15th, all remaining plants will be cleared by FECG.
- 19. Temporary Closure.** The Village reserves the right to temporarily close the Community Garden as needed, without notice, due to emergency reasons or inclement weather, or for maintenance, repairs, or other governmental purposes. The Village shall not be liable or responsible for any damage or losses to any plantings, planter boxes, gardening tools, equipment, supplies or seeds sustained during any temporary closure.
- 20. Permanent Closure.** The Village reserves the right to terminate the Community Garden Program, upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the Members if the Village, in its discretion, deems it desirable for redevelopment or other governmental purposes. If the Village decides to permanently close the Community Garden site, within the thirty (30) day notice period, the Members will be allowed to remove their plantings, planter boxes and other improvements. The Village shall not be liable or responsible for any damage or losses to any plantings, planter boxes, gardening tools, equipment, supplies or seeds sustained by a permanent closure.
- 21. Application and Assignment of Planter Boxes.** The number of eligible applicants who can be accepted to participate in the Community Garden Program is limited by the current number of planter boxes. Acceptance into the Program shall be governed, in FECG and the Village's discretion, by an open application period with advanced public notice on the Village's website of an application submittal deadline with either (1) a "first to submit, first to be selected" acceptance process or (2) a lottery selection system. However, priority will first be given to Village of Western Springs Residents, the Village of Western Springs Resident Community Groups, then owners of land within the Village, and then to members of the Village of Western Springs Business Community.
- 22. No Liability, Reimbursement or Replacement of Plantings, Tools, Equipment or Supplies.** The Village of Western Springs shall not be liable for or reimburse the cost of or provide any replacement plantings, gardening tools, equipment, supplies or seeds in the event that any Member sustains a loss of such items..
